Dear Friends,

First of all I want to thank you very much for your encouraging response to my latest letter. I received several supportive letters by email and have since received an astounding \$7000 in contributions, enough to keep the school running through the first term. From me personally, and

from the children and teachers who depend on the school, a BIG, BIG thank you.

The school re-opened on July 1st, and I spent the first few days doing nothing but testing and admitting new students. Parents have learned that seats are limited, and if they want to get their child enrolled in our school, they must come immediately on school re-opening. I admit children on a first-come, first-served basis and had to start turning away potential students starting the third day. Now, with almost all classes full (we do have a few seats open in higher grades only), we have around 250 students. These are children who, for the most part, if they were not studying in our school, would not be studying at all.

Academically we got off to the best start ever with teachers starting right in on the first day of school. Children are now well into studies and have made visible progress in just two weeks. It is amazing how fast kids can learn!

My big news is that we have decided to move the school to a new location. Our current landlord's son will likely be getting married this year, and earlier in the year the landlord said that he may need to take some rooms back for his son's use. This prompted us to start looking for another building. We saw several, but I knew it was going to be tough to find a big enough building with an appropriate layout of rooms, and hopefully a playground, and in the near vicinity so that the children could walk to school.

I am very pleased to tell you that we did find a place that is almost unbelievable! It is not perfect, but it seems like a dream come true. Lying between the two communities from which the majority of students come, it sits on a bluff overlooking the Ganges River. Take a look!



Here is the front of the building with some students standing in front of the main gate. We took them to see the new building for the first time yesterday.



Here is a straight-on view of the front; the arch of the gate shows at the lower right. On the second and third floors there are two rows of classrooms going straight back with a wide corridor in the middle (corresponding to where the



Here is one feature we didn't find in any other building -- a covered space large enough for the entire student body to assemble. We can use it for showing films or holding special programs, even in the rain! The lighted area at the back is the front gate. You are looking at about 3/4 of the available space.
