- Ankita Ankita had surgery to correct her cleft palate. She came home from the hospital about one week ago and is doing fine. It will take a lot of work for her to re-learn how to say her letter sounds, but I'm so thankful that this could happen while our volunteer speech therapist is there! This will make a huge difference in Ankita's life. Previously, she was likely to have been married to a fairly poor, probably coarse man who cared little for her, only marrying her to meet his physical (sexual) needs and be a house servant/slave. If she can speak normally (and since she is getting an education), her prospects will be much brighter. Hopefully she will be married to someone who respects her and treats her kindly.
- Annual Spring Celebration Performance Our children will be performing <u>tomorrow</u>! We had to change our venue at the last minute since, even though we got government permission to hold the performance at a certain place and time, a government group began setting up <u>their</u> stage at our venue a few days early and preempted the use of the space. The police (who had given us the permission) said there was nothing they could do about it. But, this is life in Banaras: nothing is certain until it actually happens. We were lucky we were able to shift the show to a location only 100 yards away. The space is smaller and will require some re-adjustment, but at least the show will go on!
